POSITION PURPOSE STATEMENT

The VISOR study clinician will be responsible for delivering manualised Virtual Reality (VR) therapies as part of a multi-site team of study clinicians, working with young people aged 14-25 with emerging or early psychosis to improve social functioning and social cognitive outcomes.

About VISOR

VISOR is a double-blind randomised control trial testing a new exposure-based, VR-based CBT intervention to support social functioning and social cognition in young people recovering from psychosis. VISOR is national trial led by Orygen in partnership with other youth early psychosis settings across Melbourne, Adelaide and Perth that began 1 April 2023 and will run for four years until 1 April 2027.

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POSITION KEY RESPONSIBILITY AREAS

1. Clinical interventions

- Deliver a manualised Virtual Reality-based psychological intervention, which includes components of existing evidence-based treatments (e.g. Cognitive Behavioural Therapy) as well as novel components for study participants in accordance with study manuals and protocol with a high degree of fidelity.
- The intervention will include twice weekly sessions of 60 minutes each with each participant, involving handling of VR equipment (Meta Oculus) and software on computer.
- Deliver the VR intervention within an existing clinical service, working closely with a young person's primary care team where VR therapy is delivered as an adjunctive treatment to ensure optimal patent care and risk management
- Effectively and competently manage a case load.
- Manage and undertake mental health and risk assessment, psychological treatment, and crisis intervention as necessary for study participants, and maintain accurate records of clients' progress in client files according as per study protocols.
- Attendance at clinical review and/or care team meetings as required, supporting recruitment efforts and effective care coordination.
- Complete accurate, timely, and professional clinical record keeping and documentation.

2. Research

- Delivery the VR intervention as part of a multi-site team of study clinicians, attending broader research team meetings as required.
- Be a champion for the research program, communicate regularly with, build and maintain collaborative working relationships with internal and external stakeholders.
- Collect accurate data and complete outcome and fidelity measures for the purposes of the research trial in a timely manner.
- Complete data entry as required.
- Adhere to Good Clinical Practice for Research Guidelines.

3. Other

- Contribute to a positive team culture grounded in respectful collaboration, integrity, trust, flexibility, innovation and high-quality work and client standards.
- Work as part of the project team involving multidisciplinary clinical, research and lived experience staff. Work collaboratively with clinical staff in order to provide quality care and safety to study participants.
