COURSE OUTLINE SEPTEMBER 2023 INTAKE CHC43515 - CERTIFICATE IV IN MENTAL HEALTH PEER WORK (CONSUMER)

Developed by Orygen, a global leader in youth mental health, the Certificate IV in Mental Health Peer Work (Consumer) prepares students for roles across many mental health programs, formally acknowledging a professional application of mental health lived experience.

Students will be trained by, and access resources prepared by, accomplished industry experts, supporting them to receive high quality education with the latest and most current industry knowledge.

This is a nationally approved vocational course that is recognised throughout Australia.

COURSE AIMS

Students will gain skills and knowledge in the following areas:

- Providing consumer mental health peer work (including applying lived experience)
- Evidence-based mental health frameworks, standards, and practices underpinning the role of a peer worker
- Working with people from diverse backgrounds, including First Nations peoples
- Work health and safety in the mental health sector

COURSE STRUCTURE

The course will be approximately 10 months in duration and students will take part in:

- 41 interactive virtual workshops (6 hours per week)
- Self paced learning (approximately 6 hours per week)
- Start date: September 20th, 2023
- End date: July 26th, 2024
- Holiday break: December 18th, 2023 - January 12th, 2024

PLACEMENT

Placement is an integral component of the course; it provides opportunity to apply knowledge into practice. Successful completion of placement is required to obtain the Certificate IV in Mental Health Peer Work (Consumer). Students are required to arrange placement in an approved workplace. Students will be supported by Orygen before, during, and after placement.

Placement requirements:

- In person
- In Victoria, Australia
- A peer worker must be available to provide direct supervision and support
- Orygen approved

ASSESSMENT TASKS

The assessments involved in this course have been carefully designed by industry experts to facilitate the student's development of key skills and knowledge. Assessments include written questions and reports, observational assessments, and placement.

INCLUDED MATERIALS AND RESOURCES

Students will be given access to the course materials via Orygen's online learning management system (LMS). Resources on the LMS will include learner guides, workshop recordings and slides, reading materials, and assessment templates.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- At least 18 years of age
- Personal lived experience of mental ill-health and/or alcohol or other drugs challenges
- Must be an Australian or New Zealand citizen or permanent resident
- Spoken and written English skills at a Year 10 or equivalent level
- Access to a computer with an internet connection, a microphone and webcam; and basic computer skills
- A valid Working with Children Check and Police Check (or be prepared to obtain both prior to placements)
- No vocational experience is required
- Students may need to show evidence of vaccination requirements for work placement

GRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES-

Future possible work opportunities may include peer practitioner, mental health peer support worker, or consumer advocate, in a variety of mental health settings.

CREDIT TRANSFER (CT)

Credit Transfers (CT) is the procedure of granting credit to a student for studies successfully completed at another Registered Training Organisation. Students will be required to provide a formal transcript to demonstrate successful completion.

If a student already has academic credit for any of the course units, Orygen can award a credit transfer. To access this, the student must complete a credit transfer application. Please note that while there are no additional costs to access this option, students will still be required to pay the full tuition costs.

Recognition of prior learning (RPL) is the transfer of skills and knowledge, through work and life experiences, to current training courses.

If a student wishes to have skills and experiences recognised as an academic credit, they can apply to have it assessed and considered when assessing their level of competency.
