POSITION PURPOSE STATEMENT

The Enhanced Care Clinician provides brief episodic support to young people struggling to engage with the health system. The Clinician works both within the local headspace clinical team and across the region interfacing with other Enhanced Care Clinicians as needed to provide seamless service transitions.

The key component of this role is the provision of flexible evidence-based support resulting in increased capacity to engage and support young people with complex needs in an enhanced primary care setting. This role will also respond to the needs of young people with a range of mental health and situational issues and will provide a range of therapeutic interventions and care coordination to enable engagement in the appropriate place for their ongoing care needs.

About headspace

headspace is a world-first youth mental health initiative that supports young people who are going through a tough time; whether it's depression, anxiety, relationship break-ups or alcohol and other drug issues. The youth-friendly services at headspace are aimed at teenagers and young adults in recognition of the fact that 75 percent of mental disorders emerge before the age of 25 years.

Clinical Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Work with the Clinical Services Manager to engage in and deliver shared care with the Access team, medical, co-located and contracted staff to support the provision of youth-friendly early intervention services at headspace for young people with moderate and complex mental health disorders. • Provide a range of brief episodic therapeutic interventions and care coordination as needed including assessment and short-term outreach support in accordance with best practice and clinical guidelines. • Undertake intake, assessment and referrals processes for more complex and 'higher risk' young people and assist others in the team to do so. • Provide clinical support to a caseload of complex and higher risk young people which may include providing community outreach. • Deliver evidence-based brief interventions, including group interventions, with young people and their families/carers. <p>2. Administration</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maintain accurate and timely case notes and records in approved database systems. <p>3. Stakeholder Engagement</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Participate actively in Clinical Review Meetings. • Promote positive working relationships between the Access Team and other staff and contracted professionals at headspace. • Promote the headspace program, communicate regularly with, build and maintain collaborative working relationships with health and welfare agencies and the general community. • Participate in and develop community awareness activities, relationship building activities and appropriate community and agency meetings. <p>4. Other</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promote and monitor activities supporting research projects conducted at the centre. • The role may incorporate other service development activities and responsibilities as directed by the Clinical Services Manager.

Experience / skills	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Previous experience in a clinical role in the area of youth mental health. • Previous professional experience in the planning and provision of mental health care, including completion of mental health assessments, crisis intervention, psychoeducation and short-term treatment interventions to young people experiencing mental health and/or substance use, and/or other social difficulties, including current evidence-based approaches. • Highly developed service system knowledge, relevant legislation, government policy and strategic directions in relation to mental health and alcohol and other substances particularly as it relates to young people. • Proven skills in decision-making, problem-solving and risk management, and demonstrated capacity to problem-solve effectively and work creatively with young people, particularly within an early intervention framework. • Demonstrated sound ability to make decisions in relation to conducting intake and assessments and determining a young people's suitability for ongoing treatment/support services.
