



PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Orygen Specialist Program (OSP), a program of Melbourne Health, provides specialist mental health services for young people aged 15 to 25 and focuses on providing early intervention to young people with severe and complex mental illness. OSP also works alongside Orygen, the National Centre of Excellence in Youth Mental Health which operates four primary mental health care headspace services in the catchment area.

Specialist clinical streams in OSP offer targeted interventions for psychotic disorders (including young people at 'ultra-high risk' of psychosis), mood disorders and personality disorders; and also manage co- morbid substance use disorders, eating disorders, and neurodevelopmental disorders.

These clinical streams are multidisciplinary teams that deliver individually tailored services to the young person that comprises assessment and crisis intervention, case management, medication, psychotherapy, family support, inpatient care, group work, vocational support, educational assistance, and intensive outreach.

Multidisciplinary teams deliver individually tailored services that comprise assessment and crisis intervention, case management, medication, psychotherapy, family support, inpatient care, group work, vocational support, educational assistance, and intensive outreach. Specialist clinical streams offer targeted interventions for psychotic disorders (including young people at 'ultra-high risk' of psychosis), mood disorders, and personality disorders; and also manage co-morbid substance use disorders, eating disorders, and neurodevelopment disorders. A forensic stream has also now been established providing in custodial and community justice services. Streams are supported by the Psychosocial Recovery program, Community Development program, and Orygen Training Team. Orygen also has a 19-bed Inpatient Unit, 15-bed Orygen @ Home program, Youth Access Team and emerging HOPE and YPARC programs making up the acute and sub-acute care sector. Orygen highly values responsive services for youth in the western and north western region of Melbourne. Orygen programs are to be guided by evidence-based, culturally-safe and trauma-informed principles







incorporating the diverse needs of all young people and families. This is especially important for those from LGBTQI+, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander, and culturally and linguistically diverse populations. Responsive and inclusive practices are at the forefront of all Orygen care.

DEPARTMENT DESCRIPTION

Due to the high rate of mental illness amongst Youth Justice clients and the significant increase in the number of young people entering Youth Justice custody, there is a need for early intervention specialist mental health in this cohort. The relationship between mental illness and offending behaviour in youth is complex but undeniably connected. As such, the effective early treatment of mental health issues is crucial to improving health and social outcomes for young people in or at risk of entering custody.

The Orygen Forensic Youth Mental Health Service (FYMHS) forms part of the specialist clinical programs of Orygen. FYMHS is made up of two separate streams – Community and Custodial FYMHS. The Custodial FYMHS teams are located at Parkville and Malmsbury Youth Justice Precincts (PYJP and MYJP, consecutively). The Community FYMHS stream is made up of three (3) different multi-disciplinary sub-teams that provide assessment and consultation only.

Youth Forensic Assessment & Consultation Service (YFACS)

Senior Clinical Specialist and Psychiatrists (Consultant & Registrar) provide primary and secondary forensic consultation to clients and case managers from CYMHS/CAMHS services regarding forensic risk and safety planning.

Youth Justice Mental Health Clinician (YJMHC) initiative

Senior clinicians provide primary and secondary mental health consultation to clients and community Youth Justice (YJ) case managers at Youth Justice Centres in Broadmeadows, Reservoir, Sunshine and Werribee.

• Children's Court Mental Health Advice & Response Service (CCMHARS)

CCMHARS Senior Clinicians are based at the Melbourne Children's Court to provide primary and secondary mental health consultation to the Court and its key stakeholders regarding the mental health of the young person appearing before the Court.

POSITION SUMMARY

The Senior Project Worker - FYMHS role will provide a high level of project management leadership and expertise to support the service design and delivery of an enhanced model of care to be delivered by the Orygen Custodial FYMHS team.

As part of the reforms associated with the Royal Commission into Victoria's Mental Health System (2021), it was recommended that Orygen lead the development of a service plan to expand custodial mental health services within youth justice settings across Parkville, Malmsbury and pending Cherry Creek (2023) precincts.

This position will work closely and collaboratively with the Orygen Stream Lead - FYMHS regarding the development of clinical policy and protocol regarding an enhanced and innovative model of care to support not only the delivery of specialist evidenced-based mental health services in youth justice custody, but also to support the development of transition and care pathways.

The Senior Project Worker will also support the Stream Lead – FYMHS to consider how FYMHS integrates with both Orygen specialist programs and primary programs of clinical care as well as the broader areas of policy, research and translation.

- Supporting project planning, resolve design issues, coordinate and write documentation (i.e. policies, procedures, model of care) and undertake consultation regarding enhanced model design and implementation.
- Collaboratively design, develop and support the delivery of forensic youth mental health training packages across primary and tertiary care services.







- Supporting the Orygen OSP and FYMHS leadership group in the delivery of project design and communication to key stakeholders including Justice Health and Youth Justice.
- Driving the planning and delivery of FYMHS
 Custodial enhanced model of care via effective
 project communications and change management.
- · Mentoring and supervising junior Project Workers.
- Ensuring risk and opportunity are understood and managed.
- Help drive effective project governance and developing report documentation.
- Track and monitor compliance with project plans.
- Contribute to the development and improvement of administrative process and application of new technology as required.
- Document and review framework for FYMHS specific mental health care across Orygen by engaging and collaborating with Orygen Primary, Specialist, Research and Knowledge & Translation.
- Participate in ongoing service wide improvement, delivery, initiatives and planning activities.
- Comply with Safety & Service improvement/quality management policies and procedures.
- Support and participate in Health Services

- Ensure that FYMHS service delivery is guided by evidence-based, culturally safe and traumainformed principles incorporating the diverse needs of all young people and families, including those from LGBTQI+, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander and culturally and linguistic diverse populations.
- Contribute to a culture of care, teamwork, continuous improvement, constructive performance review, high quality work standards and client service delivery.
- Monitor and achieve relevant KPIs and targets.
- Ensure all direct reporting staff receive and engage in regular feedback and participate in regular, annual discussions.
- Take reasonable care for your safety, wellbeing and that of others.



- Bachelor Degree in Nursing plus a Postgraduate qualification in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing, Bachelor Degree in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nursing or equivalent.

Social Workers:

 An approved degree in Social Work and eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Social Workers.

Occupational Therapists:

- Registration under the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act (2009) with the Occupational Therapy Board of Australia.
- An approved Degree from a recognised school of Occupational Therapy or other qualifications approved for eligibility for membership of the Australian Association of Occupational Therapy (Vic.).

Psychologists:


Registration as a Psychologist under the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation National Law Act (2009)
with practice endorsement as a Clinical, Forensic or Clinical Neuro Psychologist with the Psychology Board
of Australia (or eligibility to enter a registrar program as a clinical, forensic or clinical neuro psychologist with
the Psychology Board of Australia where relevant).

Essential:

- A minimum of 10 years' experience in the application of clinical practice in the mental health field and specifically with young people experiencing mental health disorders.
- A thorough knowledge of current mental health approaches to working with mentally ill clients with behavioural and/or forensic complexity.
- Ability to work collaboratively and effectively with CAMHS/CYMHS services.
- Capacity to develop effective working relationships, collaborations and partnerships with a range of services within the broader community service system.
- A sound knowledge of the youth justice and/or criminal justice system and other relevant community based forensic services.







- Ability to work independently and effectively within a multidisciplinary team, with evidence of sound conflict resolution skills.
- Well-developed interpersonal and communication skills (written and verbal).
- Experience and expertise in providing case management.
- Knowledge of the rationale and evidence for early intervention in mental illness.
- Ability to work collaboratively and effectively with young people and their families.
- Ability to participate in policy and service development within the program and in continuous quality improvement through ongoing evaluation of services delivered to clients.
- Understanding of the Children, Youth & Families Act 2005, Mental Health Act 2014 and other Acts/legislation relevant to working with young people in a mental health setting.
- Comply with all legal requirements pertaining to the position including responsibility for maintaining current registration as required by your professional organisation or other applicable Acts.
- Knowledge of the rationale and evidence for early intervention in mental illness.
- Ability to develop, implement and evaluate integrated client-centred individual service plans, risk assessments and diagnostic formulations.
- Ability to work independently and effectively within multidisciplinary teams.
- A commitment to ongoing professional development through access to current literature, continuing education, supervision and attendance at seminars conferences etc.
- Comply with all legal requirements pertaining to the position including responsibility for maintaining current registration as required by your professional organisation or other applicable Acts.
- Willingness to work from a community-based site and across multiple sites if required.
- A current Victorian driver's licence.
- A Working with Children check.

- Demonstrated experience at a senior clinician/clinical coordinator or clinical experience within an autonomous role.
- A working knowledge of community-based health and mental health organisations and human services organisations.
- A commitment to ongoing professional development. Maintains knowledge through access to current literature, continuing education, supervision and attendance at seminars conferences etc.
- According to professional qualifications: Demonstrated evidence of membership or Annual Continuing Professional Development as outlined by appropriate Professional Body (NBA, OTA, AASW, APS); MAASW (Acc) or AASW Accredited Mental Health Social Worker status or OT Australia Accredited Occupational Therapy status (AccOT).
